



The STEM Connection is a non-profit corporation aimed at facilitating hands-on, minds-on, feet-on-the ground science, technology, engineering and math experiences at Moore Road Farm and other educational sites. The STEM Connection 30 acre outdoor learning site at Moore Road Farm is in the Traders Point Rural Historic District conveniently located on the northwest side of Indianapolis. The ecosystems of the farm include deciduous forest, Eagle Creek, fields of crops and a garden open for exploration and learning. Programming is built on the Indiana Academic Standards and is connected with ongoing conservation projects that honor the land and waterways of Indiana and seeks to grant access to those underrepresented in the STEM fields.

**Duration:**

10 weeks, from May 28 through August 2

**Compensation:**

Compensation will be in the form of a stipend through the Indiana Sustainability Development Program.

**Service Requirement:**

Interns are expected to work 40-hour weeks

**Training Requirements:**

Must attend the bootcamp in May 2019.

**Assignments:**

Under supervision of the Executive Director, work on projects related to the wide-ranging topic of “sustainability”. Possible assignments include assisting in facilitating programming, working with conservation partners, establishing a sustainability plan for the farm space and conducting research on a variety of topics including grants, an organizational development plan and researching best practices of educational environmental non profits.

**Job Responsibilities:**

Graduate students with an education background strongly preferred; support the Executive Director on a variety of projects; support, as-needed, the wider programming of The STEM Connection.

**Required Skills:**

Google Docs and Google Sheets; proofreading; strong oral and written interpersonal communication; professionalism; flexibility; time management; ability to handle multiple tasks at once; ability to prioritize tasks; ability to work as part of a team and also independently; outstanding writing skills; strong research skills; creativity, a desire to serve children.
