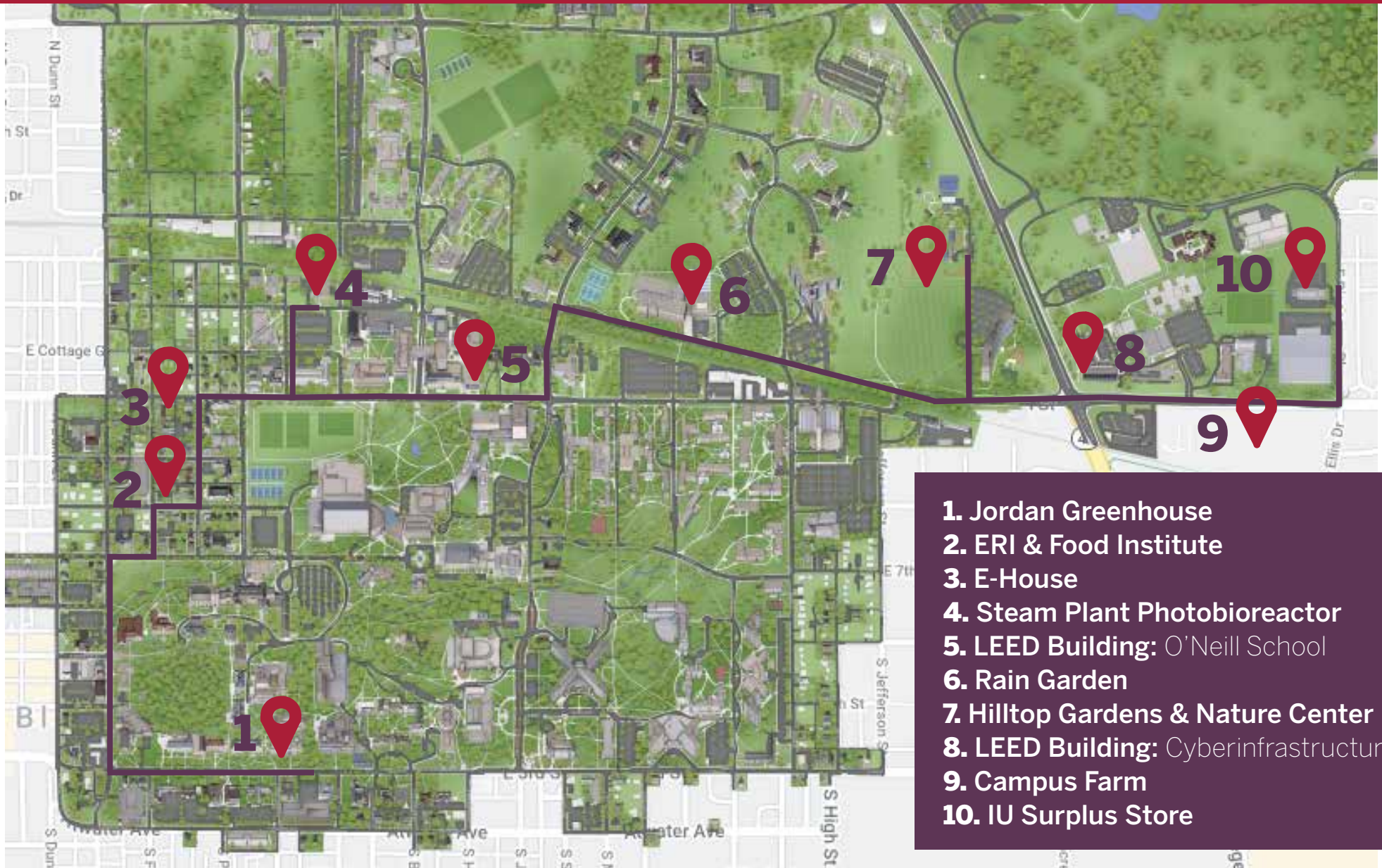

 carbon capture & sequestration, energy


The bioreactor is a carbon capture project that turns emissions into fertilizer! Using algae, the facility is able to convert the flue gas from natural gas emissions. The resulting fertilizer is used to maintain 200+ flower beds throughout campus!

The rain garden is a way to manage stormwater runoff. The garden is a shallow basin, made with native vegetation and bioretention soil. The garden stores and treats stormwater to improve water quality in addition to other environmental benefits.
